Re: Attestation for a patient's Medical Services Plan (MSP) and BC Services Card application

To ensure all eligible MSP beneficiaries can obtain a BC Services Card, the Ministry of Health will introduce a new policy by March 2018 that will enable qualified health care professionals to act as attestors on behalf of their patients.

The Attestation Process

- When enrolling or renewing enrolment in MSP, most adults need to attend an ICBC driver licensing office in person for identity proofing and to obtain their Photo BC Services Card.
- Some individuals may not be able to attend a driver licensing office due to a medical condition. They can call Health Insurance BC (HIBC) to obtain an Attestation Form (see attached sample) to take to a health care professional.
- Health care professionals in this context are:
 - Physician;
 - Registered psychologist;
 - Nurse practitioner;
 - Registered nurse or public health nurse; or
 - Medical social worker
- When a health care professional signs an Attestation Form, they are attesting that the individual has a health related issue that prevents them from attending a driver licensing office to complete in-person identity proofing.
- After the individual submits the completed form to HIBC, and enrolment or renewal of enrolment in MSP is successful, a Non-Photo BC Services Card will be mailed to the individual.
